



Moss Terrarium Bottle™

moss. (*Dicranum scoparium* 'Broom Moss', *Leucobryum glaucens* 'Cushion Moss' and *Hypnum imponens* 'Sheet Moss'). After planting, mist with a spray bottle and your moss-scape will revive out of its dormant state and grow.

how to grow. **1.** Remove the 'chopsticks' from the belly wrap of the moss terrarium bottle™ **2.** Open the terrarium bottle™ and take out the moss, ribbon band (used for the 'chopstick' base) and the bag of recycled glass drainage pebbles with soil. **3.** Open up the drainage pebble side of the bag and pour it into the terrarium bottle and shake it gently to evenly distribute. **4.** Open the soil side of the bag and pour it into a small bowl. Using a spoon, scoop the soil over the drainage pebbles distributing evenly. **5.** Using a spray bottle, lightly spray the soil into place. **6.** In a bowl filled with water submerge each of the mosses for about 30 seconds to bring them out of their dormant state. **7.** Take the 'chopstick' tool and pick up each of the mosses and place into the terrarium bottle. **8.** Push down on the top of the moss with the 'chopsticks' to tamp into place. **9.** Spray with a spray bottle to water. **10.** Put the ribbon loop around your 'chopsticks', place on a flat surface and spread the 'chopsticks' apart to form a base for your terrarium bottle™ to nest within. **11.** Place out of direct sunlight and, depending upon how hot and dry your environment is, water every 2-4 days. (A small amount of moisture should bead on the top of the bottle for adequate humidity level). **12.** Grow as a natural moss-scape or personalize with small momentos to create your own miniature landscape.
